ARTISTIC STAFF



Nicolina Lawson, Executive & Artistic Director

Nicolina Lawson founded Ballet North Texas in November 2017 for the purpose of bringing, and continually expanding, productions of contemporary, neo-classical, and classical concert dance to the Dallas, Texas area through its own professional ballet company. Throughout Mrs. Lawson's long performance career, she performed nationally and internationally, acquiring a vast repertory that

includes many principal roles in classical and contemporary works that heavily influence her choreography. In 2019 she founded North Texas Conservatory as the official school of Ballet North Texas, bringing a wealth of experience to the organization as a dancer, choreographer, and businesswomen.



Cindy Michaels, Ballet Master & Resident Choreographer

Cindy Michaels, originally from California, served as Artistic Director of Redding City Ballet from 1997 to 2012, and as Director of Dance for the Shasta College Fine Arts Department teaching ballet, modern dance, Choreography/Dance Analysis, and Partnered Adagio classes. Her thirty-year performance and teaching career has provided her with extensive knowledge of classical and

contemporary ballet repertory as well as the mechanics that govern the technique of classical training. She has set historical works, and created numerous works of her own for operas, musicals, summer theater festivals and now, Ballet North Texas.



Marlen Alimanov, Master Teacher & Guest Performer

Marlen Alimanov began his training at age nine at the Almaty Ballet Academy in Kazakhstan. After graduating he danced with the Almaty Ballet and Opera, Ballet Novosibirsk and the Russian National Ballet, which brought him to the States in 2010. After his arrival Mr. Alimanov danced with Manassas Ballet Theater, New Jersey Ballet

Company, and Texas Ballet Theater. Mr. Alimanov has had the pleasure of dancing leads such as Romeo in Romeo and Juliet, Frederic in Ben Stevenson's Dracula, Escamillo in Carlos Acosta's Carmen, The Prince in the Nutcracker, Prince Desire in Sleeping Beauty and highlight roles in Etudes and Seven Sonatas. Marlen is currently a principal guest artist in the DFW area and a Master Teacher at BNT.

Lisa Miller, Resident Lighting Designer

Lisa Miller works with many organizations in the Dallas/Fort Worth area, including Texas Ballet Theater and Kitchen Dog Theater. She is also Lighting Director for The Galveston Island East End Theatre Company. Lisa is the founder of Hope Rising, an arts organization in North Texas that seeks to raise awareness and put an end to Sexual

and Domestic Violence through the arts. She has been the resident lighting designer for Ballet North Texas since its founding, taking on notable full-length ballets as well as mix rep performances.



Allan González, Resident Photographer & Videographer

Allan González is the founder of a local professional photography business called AAfotos / DFW Dance Photography. His work is all about capturing the essence of a moment, and the beauty of a performance, staying true to the heart of each image and subject. He has been the resident photographer of Ballet North Texas since its

founding, producing all the images for the dancers and media.



Lorinda Mitchell, Costume Designer & Backstage Manager

Sewing various items since the age of 10, Lorinda discovered her love of ballet costumes in 2010, perfecting the tradition of tutu and tunic construction. She has been assisting with costuming and backstage organization for Ballet North Texas since their first Nutcracker in 2018, working directly with Mrs. Lawson and other choreographers

in the design of the ballets. She is also the founder and curator of Sew Busy Creations.



Lindsi Dec, Resident Regisseur & Master Teacher

Lindsi Dec is from Fairfax, Virginia. She trained at Washington School of Ballet and joined Pacific Northwest Ballet as an apprentice in 2001. She was promoted to corps de ballet in 2002, soloist in 2009, and principal in 2014. Ms. Dec retired from Pacific Northwest Ballet in July of 2020. Upon retirement, she and her husband, Karel Cruz,

founded DeCruz Ballet in San Antonio. In addition to working with BNT, she continues to freelance as a guest artist, teach master classes, and stage ballets for Kiyon Gaines.


